

VEHICLE FUNDRAISING

Our work has shown that in rural areas transportation is a lifeline to any forward mobility. Watauga County lacks any detox facilities, inpatient treatment options or supportive housing. This lack of options often means many residents must leave Watauga County in order to access these types of recovery support.

In 2022 we drove over 15,000 miles to connect people with recovery resources. This is near the equivalent of driving across the United States coast to coast six times. Transportation has and continues to be one of the largest bridges to connect for people trying to access recovery supports in our rural area.

Thanks to our community we were able to raise over \$40,000 to purchase our own vehicle!

SEEKING STRENGTH IS A THERAPEUTIC GROUP FOR WOMEN WHO HAVE EXPERIENCED TRAUMA, SUBSTANCE USE AND/OR POST TRAUMATIC STRESS DISORDER. THIS GROUP FOCUSES ON TEACHING SAFE COPING SKILLS IN THE PRESENT FOR GENERAL WELLBEING AND DEVELOPMENT OF COPING SKILLS WHILE CONNECTING WITH OTHER WOMEN IN THE COMMUNITY.
